Fun Facts about Robin Hood

- 1. Robin Hood is known for dressing in green in order to blend in with the trees while waiting to rob rich passers-by.
- 2. In some medieval dialects, the words Hood and Wood were pronounced the same. And Robert, pronounced in a French accent, could sound like Robber. So the name Robin Hood might simply be the Robber in the Woods.
- 3. Sherwood Forest was huge, about 100,000 acres. In medieval days, a "forest" was an administrative area owned by the King. It was his hunting preserve and not necessarily an area of woodland, as the term means today.
- 4. The current Sheriff of Nottingham is a very nice lady by the name of Nicola Heaton.
- Robin Hood has been portrayed in over 100 films and numerous books. He has been played by Errol Flynn (1938), Sean Connery (1976) and Kevin Costner (1991), and by a fox in the 1973 Disney cartoon version.
- 6. Robin is said to have hidden from his enemies in the Major Oak tree in Sherwood Forest. The huge tree is almost 1000 years old, measures about 10 metres around, has a leaf canopy of 28 metres and weighs an estimated 23 tons. It still stands to this day.
- 7. There is a grave at Kirklees Priory in Yorkshire, England, which is said to be where Robin Hood is buried. Legend has it that when he knew he was dying, Robin fired an arrow, asking to be buried where it landed.
- 8. Nottinghamshire is promoted as 'Robin Hood County', and has hundreds of places in the town that are named after the outlaw. The main tourist attractions include The Old County Gaol, where Robin was held captive by the Sheriff of Nottingham, the church where he wed his beloved Marian, and an impressive statue of him outside of Nottingham Castle.
