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Director's Message — Sandy Mitchell

When I first saw Looking a few years ago at CentreStage theatre in Kentville, I immediately thought it was a play that our BP audiences would enjoy. Judging by the amount of fun the cast and crew have had during rehearsals, you definitely won't be disappointed! This play takes place before online dating sites had become the norm, when the only choice was to search the classified ads in the hope of finding true love!

This is my very first foray into directing, and it's been a most enjoyable experience. I hope you agree that this is the perfect cast for this show. I also had a "dream team" to work with behind the scenes, especially my Stage Manager, Amanda Willmore, who always had my back and gave 110% every time.

Synopsis of the Play

Looking is the story of four middle-aged singles who are seeking relationships while navigating life's pitfalls.

Andy and Matt are long-time buddies looking for sure-fire ways to meet women. Val and Nina are best friends forever looking to meet men. Val is an O.R. nurse, Andy is in the storage business, Nina is a police officer, and Matt is the host of a morning radio show. Val agrees to meet Andy at a bar, and Nina and Matt are coaxed into joining their friends for support. Their relationships progress through the following weeks, setting off laughable plot twists and an unexpected hookup.

Cleverly written, touchingly funny, witty and insightful, *Looking* shows us we don't always get what we set our sights on, but what we end up with can be an unexpected surprise.

One of Norm Foster's "best, most enduring and endearing plays", *Looking* was first produced at the Victoria Playhouse in Petrolia, Ontario, in June 2005.

The Time & Place: The play takes place in 2005 in a variety of venues over the course of a couple of months.


ACT I September 2005 at the Players Sports Club

Meet the Playwright—Norm Foster



Norm Foster has been called Canada's preeminent comic playwright. He is the most produced playwright in the history of the country and he receives, on average, an astounding 150 productions of his plays each year. It has been said that on any given day of the year, there is a Norm Foster play either in rehearsal or in performance somewhere in the world.

Foster is widely praised around the globe for his ability to write what he describes as "plays about ordinary people just trying to get by in life". Those plays have earned him such accolades as "Foster's stage writing remains one of Canada's greatest theatrical treasures," and "one of the funniest writers of intelligent comedy in Canadian theatre today". Not limiting his efforts only to writing, Foster also appears on stage as an actor several times each year.

Norm Foster has over 65 plays to his credit, including *The Foursome*, *The Melville Boys*, *Wrong For Each Other*, *The Love List*, *Outlaw*, *Lunenburg*, *Old Love*, *Looking*, *Halfway There* and *Mending Fences*.

Foster's plays are known mainly for their comedic qualities, but they are not without their serious moments as well. As

Foster himself has said, "I find it far more satisfying if I can make an audience laugh and feel a little heartache within the same story".

He is the recipient of the Los Angeles Drama-Logue Award for his play *The Melville Boys*, The Beverly Hills NAACP award for his play *The Motor Trade*, and in 2009 Foster was a finalist for the Ontario Premier's Award For Excellence In The Arts.

Norm Foster was made an Officer of The Order of Canada in 2016 for his outstanding contribution to Canadian arts and culture. He is a long-time resident of Fredericton, New Brunswick.

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


